

In Praise of Women

1. ACOSTA, Cristovam de [or Christovão da Costa, or Christoval Acosta]. *Tratado em loor de las mugeres, y de la castidad, onestidad, constancia, silencio y justicia; con otras muchas particularidades y varias historias*. FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this eloquent *apologia* defending Womankind against a *mordaz murmurador's* vitriolic letter. Among women's contributions to civilization are the Republic (an apparent extension of the family unit), the invention of writing, written law, astrology, clocks, balls and games, and the production and use of flour.

An interesting passage describes the terrifying Croctas of Ethiopia, born of a lion and a hyena. Combining the worst elements of its parents, it nevertheless protects its own kind, in contrast to the vicious and perfidious behavior of human beings, especially of men who maltreat women. Of Ethiopia, he goes on to say that, although as a people the Ethiopians are somewhat barbaric, the women are treated with great honor and respect.

Acosta also includes a list of vocations which women have undertaken and a list of *periueros, ingratos, crueles* men, who have made life miserable for women. The running subtext of this erudite tome (with thoughtful references to Classical texts and Biblical passages) is that if men would treat women correctly (which they do not) then there would be a greater understanding between men and women, and hence among humanity in general.

Acosta (ca. 1538-1594) was born in either Cueta or Tangiers, probably to Portuguese parents of Jewish ancestry—he referred to himself as African. Trained at the Universidade de Coimbra, he practiced medicine for many years in India while in the service of the Portuguese viceroy, and also travelled extensively in Persia, China and Africa. His important *Tractado delas drogas, y medicinas de las Indias Orientales*, Burgos 1578 comprises Acosta's own observations as well as much information taken from Garcia da Orta's *Coloquios dos simples e drogas e cousas medicinais da India*, Goa 1563. After a shipwreck and temporary enslavement, Acosta settled in Burgos to practice medicine. Acosta withdrew from society after the death of his wife. The *Tratado em loor de las mugeres*, dedicated to the Infanta Doña Catalina d' Austria, dates to this final period of Acosta's life, and was published the same year and by the same publisher as his *Tratado en contra y pro de la vida solitaria*, which has the same engraved border for its title page.



Ameno (1713-1793). Sometime schoolteacher, minor literary talent, editor, and translator of Italian opera libretti, Ameno opened a Lisbon printing office in 1748.

Augustine's *Soliloquia* is argued to be the direct literary predecessor of the *Confessions*, with respect to how allegory is used in the organization of an inner dialogue (see Brian Stock, *Augustine's Inner Dialogue: The Philosophical Soliloquy in Late Antiquity*, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2010, p. 74). The soliloquies also influenced theologians of the Middle Ages, including Anselm of Canterbury's *Monologion* (Stock, p. 67)



This is a superlative catalogue of one of the best exhibitions of manuscripts, early printed books, maps, and bindings ever assembled. It was held at The Grolier Club from September 19 to December 18, 2021. One hundred two items are meticulously catalogued, incorporating significant new scholarship. In addition to Coddington and O’Neill, Patrick Lenaghan also contributed descriptions. O’Neill provides an excellent article, “Archer M. Huntington and the Creation of the Library of the Hispanic Society of America” (pp.15-23). There is an extensive bibliography (pp. 239-55), as well as an Index of Authors, Titles and Printers (pp. 256-9).

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this book of poems. The preface by Machado de Assis, dated in print Julho de 1882, occupies pp. [5]-9. Machado de Assis has been described as the greatest mulatto novelist, Brazil's greatest writer and the most original novelist to appear in the Western Hemisphere during the nineteenth century. He was born in Rio de Janeiro, son of a black housepainter and a Portuguese woman from the Azores. His intelligence and tenacity enabled him to achieve important positions in the government bureaucracy and, ultimately, presidency of the Brazilian Academy of Letters.

According to Wilson Martins, Raymundo Corrêa can be regarded as a precursor to Symbolism.

FIRST EDITION of the first comprehensive treatise on proper Portuguese spelling, and only the second published study of any aspect of the Portuguese language, preceded by Fernão de Oliveira's Portuguese grammar of 1536 (see Saraiva & Lopes, *História da literatura portuguesa*, 9th ed., p. 25). It can be seen as part of the widespread effort in the sixteenth century to standardize the orthography of vernaculars.

Duarte Nunes de Leão (ca. 1530-1608), whose name appears on the title page as Duarte Nunez de Lião (which is sometimes also given as Liam), historian, philologist, geographer, and jurisconsult (ca. 1530-1608), was born at Évora and studied civil law at Coimbra. He eventually rose to the position of judge of the Casa da Supplicação (court of appeals). His many other published works include the *Repertorio dos cinco livros das ordenações* (Lisbon, 1560), an important summary of Portuguese laws (updated by his *Leis extravagantes*, Lisbon, 1569), *Chronicas dos Reis de Portugal* (Lisbon, 1600), *Origem da lingoa portuguesa* (Lisbon, 1606), and *Descrição do Reino de Portugal* (Lisbon, 1610).

Provenance: Aníbal [or Annibal] Fernandes Thomáz [or Tomás], 1849-1911. Writer, government official, and distinguished bibliophile, he was also a collector of ex-libris, super-libris, rare books, and prints. Fernandes Thomaz was born in Figueira-da-Foz and served as a postal inspector in Lisbon, as well as in other government posts. Concurrently he formed an outstanding library of books and prints and published prolifically on bibliographical and historical topics. His writings include works on Camões, Portuguese bookplates, Portuguese super-libris, Portuguese engravers, and engraved and lithographic portraits. His library was sold at auction in 1912; the catalogue is one of the most important for Portuguese books.

FIRST and ONLY complete EDITION—A COMPLETE RUN. There appears to exist a facsimile reprint of the first issue only, Vila do Conde: Lidergraf, 2016. Founded in the Spring of 1952, this review ended with issue 13, the first and only issue of volume IV, dated October 1960. There were no issues published from October 1957 and June 1959. The present set contains the four issues, numbered 1 through 4 of volume I in the first binding, the four issues of volume II in the second, numbered 5 through 8, and the four issues of volume III, numbered 9 through 12, together with the 13th issue, which is the lone issue for volume IV, in the third binding. There are indexes in issues 4, 8, and 12 to volumes I, II, and III, respectively. The review was edited by Carlos de Passos, Jorge Guimarães, and Carlos Bastos. The three final numbers were also edited by Armino Guimarães upon the death of Carlos de Passos. Critics were Octávio Sérgio and Vergílio Passos for art, Roberto Nobre for cinema, P. Rebelo Bonito and Humberto d'Ávila for music, and Julião Quintinha for theater.

There are texts, some of considerable importance, by Agustina Bessa Luís, António Sergio, Eugénio de Andrade, Fernando Namora, Jacinto do Prado Coelho, Óscar Lopes, Ribeiro Couto, Teixeira de Pascoaes, Diogo de Macedo, António Pedro, José Augusto-França, Alberto de Monsaraz, Américo Cortez Pinto, António Rebordão Navarro, Cabral do Nascimento, the Conde d'Aurora, Fernando Pamplona, Fidelino de Figueiredo, Hipólito Raposo, João de Barros, João de Castro Osório, Maria Archer, Natércia Freire, Reinanldo dos Santos and Cecília Meireles.

The review is of paramount value for the graphic arts. The covers are multi-colored, designed by leading artists, and each issue is profusely illustrated, with some illustrations in color. Artists were Abel Mendes, Amândo Silva, António Quadros, Carlos Botelho, Columbano Bordalo Pinheiro, Fausto Sampaio, Feliciano Guimarães, Gouveia Portuense, Henrique Moreira, Isolino Vaz, José Santos, Júlio Rezende, Lagoa Henriques, Luís Dourdil, Martins da Costa, Portinari, Roberto Nobre, and Vinício Cruz. Beginning with issue number 12 additional information relating to the art market is included: notices about exhibitions, sales, auctions, as well as a section in which buyers and sellers of works of art could make contact.



FIRST EDITION; a second appeared in Paris, 1828. Among the topics: the United States Consitution, Hesse-Darmstadt, social reform, political science, government and aristocracy in France and Great Britain, Latin America, the Jesuits, the Congress of Aix-la-Chapelle (1818) and the Congress of Carlsbad (1819), following the Napoleonic Wars, the former French colony of Santo Domingo, and the "Manifeste de la nation portugaise."

Pradt (1759-1837) was born in Allanches (Auvergne) and received a doctorate of theology from the Université de Paris in 1786. In 1789 he was elected to the États Généraux, where he defended the interests of the clergy until fleeing to Germany after the outbreak of the French Revolution. For the next decade he lived in Hamburg and Münster, where he published several works critical of the Revolution. Returning to France in 1800, Pradt soon earned Napoleon's favor, and with it the offices of bishop of Poitiers (1805) and archbishop of Malines (1808). He undertook several diplomatic missions for Napoleon but, unable to serve church and state equally, found the work increasingly repugnant. Pradt renounced his office in 1816, immediately placing his pen in the service of liberal ideas and against monarchy. Of Pradt's 50 or so published works, all but a handful appeared from 1816 or later. 
First Portuguese folio edition. There is also a quarto edition of the same publisher, the same year. No priority has been established.

Article VI fixes duties on Portuguese wines entering Russia. Indigo and tobacco from Brazil are mentioned in Article VIII, as is Portuguese olive oil. Freedom of religion for Portuguese in Russia and Russians in Portugal is guaranteed in Article II. Article XIX deals with desertion of sailors. Article XXIII deals with weapons and naval artillery on ships.

Second edition of the first ecclesiastical legal code for Portuguese America. First published Lisbon, 1719. There were also editions of Lisbon, 1765 and São Paulo, 1853. All are very rare. Borba de Moraes states of the three eighteenth-century editions "they probably consist of only one edition or printing with new title pages." We have not been able to examine the 1765 edition, but comparing the present copy of the 1720 edition to that of 1719, this is not the case. While both have the same engraved architectural title page with the portrait of Monteiro da Vide seated in his Episcopal chair in the Bahia Cathedral, flanked by smaller portraits of the four previous archbishops, they are otherwise typographically similar, but printed in different settings of type. Borba also states "The engraved frontispiece is missing in many copies.... and it is rare to find it in perfect condition with the following words at the foot: 'Primeiras Constituições Synodais Do Arcebispado da Bahia Feytas, e ordenadas pelo Il.mo e Rmo S.or D. Sebastião Monteiro da Vide,' etc., etc. These words were cut off by many binders, thus mutilating the plate." It is signed I.F. Benard. del. et Scul. The present copy contains the plate intact, with the exception of two letters of text in the final word affected by worming. Some copies which contain the engraved title lack the printed title page, also present here.

The main text ends on p. 472, and is followed by a thorough and detailed index which ends on p. 618. Then comes a divisional title for the 32 page catalogue of Brazilian bishops, written by Father Prudencio do Amaral. After each of the fourteen biographies he composed a Latin epigram. This section was not included in the 1853 edition.

D. Sebastião Monteiro da Vide, S.J. (Villa de Monforte, Alentejo, 1643-Bahia, 1722) entered the Jesuit Order at Évora, later receiving a degree in canon law from Coimbra

University. Named Archbishop of Bahia in December 1701, arriving in Bahia May 1722, he convened the synod which wrote these *Constituições* in 1707. He also wrote *História da vida e morte da madre Soror Victoria da Encarnação, religiosa no convento. de Santa Clara da cidade da Bahia*, Rome: Na Estamparia de João Domingos Chracas, 1720.


