

Extremely Interesting and Important for its Information about the Portuguese Court and Public Administration in Rio de Janeiro

1. AZEVEDO, Joaquim José de, 1º Visconde do Rio Secco. Exposição analytica, e justificativa da conducta, e vida publica do Visconde do Rio Secco, desde o dia 25 de Novembro de 1807, em que Sua Magestade Fidelissima o incubio dos arranjamentos necessarios da sua retirada para o Rio de Janeiro, até o dia 15 de Septembro de 1821, em cujo anno dimittirá todos os lugares e empregos de responsabilidade de fazenda, com permissão de Sua Alteza Real o Principe Regente do Brazil, concedida por decreto de 27 de Agosto do presente anno, publicada por elle mesmo. FIRST EDITION. Borba comments, "extremely interesting and important for the information [it] provide[s] about the Portuguese Court and public administration in Rio de Janeiro at that time, and ... very difficult to find." Although nominally a biography, the *Exposição* includes much information not found elsewhere about the transfer of the Portuguese royal family to Brazil and contemporary political events.

The Visconde do Rio Secco, a wealthy merchant born at Belém, near Lisbon, was a confidant of D. João and often provided financial assistance. Along with Admiral Manuel da Cunha Souto Maior, he was charged with organizing the royal family's move to Brazil in 1807, and once there, held several important positions in the royal household in Rio de Janeiro. He administered the Fazenda de Santa Cruz and served as Director of the Brazilian Bank. His eminent position led to some public opprobrium, which he attempted to counter in this pamphlet and in *Breve exposição do comportamento publico do Visconde do Rio Secco*, Lisbon 1821. Innocêncio comments on the *Exposição:* "Posto que esta memoria pareça dirigir-se especialmente a elucidar questões pessoaes do seu publicador, é todavia interessante pelas particularidades que encerra no tocante á transferencia da côrte de Portugal para o Brasil, e aos successos políticos do tempo; apresentando noticias curiosas e aproveitaveis, que n'outra parte se não encontrarão." Included with the main text (pp. 1-39) are 4 pages of notes, 28 pages of supporting documents, 9 pages of appendix and



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a single leaf entitled "Methodo pelo qual se ha de governar o fiel da caixa da emissão para o governo do troco das notas ao povo."

After independence the Visconde became a Brazilian citizen and was named first Marquez de Jundiahy. He died in Rio de Janeiro in 1835.

#### Portugal's Greatest Sculptor Describes His Finest Work

FIRST EDITION of this significant work by Portugal's greatest sculptor (1731-1822), a celebrated figure throughout Europe in the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. The *Descripção* is the artist's detailed comments on the style and execution of his finest work, the equestrian statue of D. José I, erected in 1775 as part of the rebuilding of central Lisbon after the disastrous earthquake of 1755. The stages of construction are illustrated with sections and cross-sections of the horse and rider, views of the statue from different angles, and details of armor and ornamentation. This bronze statue remains one of Lisbon's most important monuments, and dominates one of the major squares of Europe, the Praça do Comercio or "Black Horse Square," known as the "Terreiro do Paço" prior to the earthquake, due to the fact that the former royal palace stood there. Lisbon residents sometimes still refer to the square by that name.

In the introduction, Machado de Castro comments on similar works of art in the rest of Europe. The supplement is a descriptive catalogue of 65 public statues in Europe, many of them since destroyed or moved from their original sites.

The first two plates, which are allegorical, were executed in Madrid by the Spanish engraver Rafael Esteves, and are dated 1805. The remaining 23 plates, comprising



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diagrams, sketches of the monument, and allegorical compositions, were engraved in Lisbon by the noted Portuguese engraver José Lucius da Costa, a.k.a. Lucius. Dates of these plates range from 1793 to 1796.



Second edition, the first printed outside Spain, and one of only two printed in the seventeenth century. This edition, dedicated to Antonio Rodriguez de Frechilla, is as rare as the first, which had appeared in Madrid, 1614, dedicated to Rodrigo de Tapia. The third edition was only printed over 100 years later. The present edition contains on leaf a2 verso the sonnet by Cervantes "El Autor a su pluma", which was omitted from most subsequent editions.

The *Viage del Parnaso* is Cervantes' largest poetical work, written two years prior to his death. It is a humorous survey of contemporary poets, which when found deficient, were thrown overboard from a ship sailing to Parnassus.



#### First Constitution of the Mexican State of Chihuahua Applied to Parts of Texas, Arizona and New Mexico Abolishes Slavery

Very rare early reprinting of the first constitution of the free Mexican state of Chihuahua, which then included the future city of El Paso, Texas. At the time Chihuahua also included parts of present day Arizona and New Mexico, which were later ceded to the United States in the Gadsden Purchase, 1853-1854. Titulo II, article 7, page 5 abolishes slavery In Chihuahua; the institution was abolished throughout Mexico only in 1829. This is one of the earliest works printed in Chihuahua. It is long and specific on the rights and obligations of the "Chihuahuenses" encompassing 21 "Titulos" with 129 articles.

The first 14 numbers of this weekly newspaper, edited by Francisco Soares Franco, which ran from October 1, 1811 to December 29, 1813. A complete run consists of 75 numbers. In addition to agriculture and commerce, including much on Brazilian products, with prices, there is a significant amount of space devoted to military operations during the Peninsular War. Each issue contains a section on ships which had arrived in Lisbon's harbor.

Soares Franco (1772-1844) was born in Loures, near Lisbon, and died in Lisbon. He was a professor of medicine at Coimbra, a deputy to the Cortes in 1821 and a member of the Royal Council. He also wrote the highly esteemed *Ensaio sobre os melhoramentos de Portugal*, *e do Brazil*, Lisbon, 1820-1821.

Early, incomplete run of this daily newspaper, which continued until 1844. Each issue contains both national and international news, as well as theatrical notices, while many issues include poetry, financial market quotations, and news about publications.

Prohibits Free Mulattos and Slaves in Brazil from carrying knives, and sets out punishments. Dated 24 January 1756. Signed in print by the King, with that of the Marquez de Penalva below, near the foot of the recto. Amends similar laws of 29 March 1719 and 25 June 1749. Stiffens the penalties for Brazilian black or mulatto slaves who use knives and other forbidden weapons, from ten years in the galleys to 100 lashes in the pillory on ten alternating days. Free blacks are subject to a different set of laws.

Previously, Christiano Henriques Smith had been granted the right to establish a factory to refine four different qualities of sugar. The present Alvará confirms this grant, and allows him to refine two additional qualities. Dated 7 April 1770. Signed in print on p. 16 by the King, with that of Pombal below (as Conde de Oeyras).


Dated 26 February 1798. The Infanta Maria Teresa de Bragança (Ajuda, Lisbon, 1793-Trieste, 1874), granddaughter of Queen D. Maria I, was briefly second in line to the Portuguese throne, after her father, the future D. João VI. An extreme reactionary in later life, she supported her youngest brother, D. Miguel in his usurpation of the Portuguese crown, and her brother-in-law and cousin, D. Carlos de Bourbon, Carlist pretender to the Spanish crown, whom she married following the death of her sister. Her first marriage was to her cousin Prince Pedro Carlos of Spain and Portugal, who died in 1812. They had a son, Infante Sebastião of Portugal and Spain (Rio de Janeiro, 1811-Pau, 1875), Carlist army commander in the First Carlist War. The printed signature of Domingos Pires Monteiro Bandeira appears on the second leaf recto.

#### Rivera Assumes the Presidency of Guatemala

A crisis caused the Guatemalan national assembly to remove Doctor Pedro José Antonio Molina Mazariegos as president and to appoint Antonio Rivera, a liberal politician, in his place. Rivera assumed the presidency on 9 March 1830, on which day he issued this announcement that he had assumed the position and calling on the people to remain calm.





FIRST EDITION, and the only early one. All published of a collection of novellas in prose and verse. The preliminaries contain sonnets in praise of the author by Cervantes, Quevedo, and other Golden Age Spanish writers. There are also neo-Latin poems. Licenses on leaf a2, one in Spanish, the other in Catalan, are dated Barcelona, 22 October and 20 September, respectively. However, there is no record of any Barcelona edition. Cervantes and Rosel, who were good friends, were both in Valladolid at the time. Leaves a3 through a4 recto consist of a dedication by the author to Louis XIII of France. Leaves c2 verso and c3 recto contain a preface in Italian by Giulio Cesare Capaccio.


